HOLLY ATKINSON, M.D.

Dr. Holly Atkinson is on the faculty at the CUNY School of Medicine in New York City, where she is Distinguished Medical Lecturer. She is also an Assistant Professor of Medical Education at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in an adjunct capacity, where she oversees the health and human rights educational initiatives. Dr. Atkinson has a broad background in human rights, having served on the board of directors of the Nobel Peace Prize-winning organization Physicians for Human Rights for more than 16 years, including four years as President.

SHARON COOPER, M.D.

Dr. Sharon Cooper is a developmental and forensic pediatrician who evaluates and treats children who have been victims of all forms of abuse, though her primary area of expertise is the impact of sexual exploitation. Dr. Cooper holds faculty positions at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill and the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences in Bethesda, Maryland. She is a consultant and board member of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

SHARON LAMB, PH.D, ED.D.

Dr. Sharon Lamb is Professor of Counseling Psychology in the Department of Counseling and School Psychology at UMass Boston. An experienced clinician, she is Board Certified in Counseling Psychology. Dr. Lamb is a co-author of the American Psychological Association's Task Force Report on the Sexualization of Girls. She is the primary author of the updated report on the Sexualization of Girls, commissioned by Culture Reframed.

CORDELIA ANDERSON, MA

Ms. Cordelia Anderson, founder of Sensibilities Prevention Services of Minneapolis, has conducted over 2,500 presentations nationally and internationally on topics including: prevention of child sexual abuse/exploitation, impact of pornography, normalization of sexual harm, promotion of sexual health, bullying/cyber-bullying, restorative justice, compassion fatigue, and bringing activism into our work.

HEATHER FORKEY, M.D.

Dr. Heather Forkey is Assistant Director of FaCES and an Attending Pediatrician with the Child Protection Program at UMass Memorial Children's Medical Center. She is also an Assistant Professor at the University of Massachusetts Medical School. Prior to her tenure in Massachusetts, Dr. Forkey was the Co-Director of Safe Place: The Center for Child Protection and Health at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP).

CAROLYN WEST, PH.D.

Dr. Carolyn West is an award-winning author and Associate Professor of Psychology at the University of Washington. Dr. West has authored or co-authored more than 40 journal articles and book chapters. She is editor/contributor of *Violence in the Lives of Black Women: Battered, Black, and Blue*, which was published by Routledge in 2002 (winner of the 2004 Carolyn Payton Early Career Award). She is the recipient of the Outstanding Research Award from the University of Minnesota's Institute on Domestic Violence in the African American Community.

JACKSON KATZ, PH.D.

Jackson Katz is an educator, author, filmmaker, and cultural theorist who is internationally renowned for his pioneering scholarship and activism on issues of gender and violence. In 1993 he co-founded the Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP), one of the longest-running and most influential sexual assault and relationship abuse prevention programs in high schools, colleges, sports culture, and the military in North America and beyond. He lectures extensively in the U.S. and around the world on violence, media and masculinities.

DEBORAH OTTENHEIMER, M.D.

Dr. Deborah Ottenheimer spent seven years working with adolescent girls in the South Bronx and continues to focus on adolescent and young adult health care. In addition to her private practice, Dr. Ottenheimer works as a medical volunteer in Haiti. She is also an active member of Physicians for Human Rights and voluntary faculty at the Icahn School of Medicine Human Rights Clinic. She is an expert in pediatric and adolescent sexual abuse and assault.

MARK REID, MFT, CSAT

Mark Reid's primary area of interest and specialty is working with couples. This includes premarital counseling, communication difficulties, recovery from affairs and sex addiction, and parenting together after divorce. In his previous career, Mr. Reid spent more than 30 years producing fundraising TV programs for national and international nonprofit organizations.
